Educational Workshops

Practical Self-Defense Applications

Children, teens, and women can be exposed to a variety of practical techniques to verbally de-escalate a confrontation or fight back as a last resort.

This workshop covers many of the common types of attacks children, teens and women face, along with "common sense" solutions to combat them.

Information is shared in an interactive, fast-paced, fun-filled program that helps children and adults gain a quick understanding of the techniques taught and how to apply them in "real life" situations.

Fingerprinting / Child ID Registration

Enrolling children, teens, and adults in our ID registration system helps law enforcement and emergency services personnel expedite the search for a missing person. Optional resources provide additional tools to aid in a search.

Safety Fair: Putting It All Together

We normally conduct "Safety Fairs" on a Friday or Saturday as part of a community outreach event. The church hosts the event, promotes it in the local community, and members invite their family, friends, and those in their neighborhoods to attend.

The host church has an opportunity to showcase the various programs they have to offer, share refreshments, and conduct follow-up on those who attend.

We've found these to be a unique way to reach the unreached with the message of the Gospel.
