



## Child ID Program

Every year, more than 800,000 kids go missing. The first 48 hours is crucial to a positive outcome.

Kid-Safe Communities offers a Child ID program to help parents provide important information to law enforcement and emergency services personnel should a child become missing or is injured.

Optional Internet-based child profiles can be created, as well as ID profiles that can be stored and carried in a purse, wallet or on a keychain.



Law enforcement agencies and trained volunteers regularly partner with us to assist in the enrollments, with corporate and small business sponsors helping to fund the purchase of ID kits. This allows us to offer Child ID kits free of charge to all school-aged children.



Additional education and safety resources can also be made available (for a nominal fee) at these events.

The Kid-Safe Communities is a proactive 501(c)3 non-profit organization committed to helping families, schools, churches and communities decrease acts of violence against children from all sources, including:

- Bullying / Cyberbullying
- Abuse / Molestation
- Sexual Predation



We believe children have the right to grow up in a safe environment, and offer a number of safety education programs to raise awareness of abuse

and how families, schools, churches and communities can come together to make a positive difference in the lives of our children.

We partner with local schools to help bring these resources to the children and their families through classroom talks, assemblies, PTO events, parent/teacher conferences, and other venues.

Community businesses partner with us to provide the funding for our programs, making this a truly "community" partnership.

### **Predator Awareness**

One of every family's greatest fears is having a child abducted or abused by a predator. Kid-Safe addresses this very serious problem in an fun, educational workshop. We expose common predator lures, raise awareness, and demonstrate some practical safety tips and defensive countermeasures.



### **Bully-Buster**



One in three children are bullied each day in public schools across the country. Helping kids deal with bullies, and learning how not to be bullies themselves, is something all school educators deal with.

We teach the "Bully Buster" program, which has been endorsed by the Boy and Girl Scouts, National PTA, National Education Association, and Sports Illustrated.

### **Internet Safety**

At any given time, there are 3,000,000 in anonymous chat rooms online. 34,000 registered sex offenders were recently identified in a MySpace.com/FBI sting. Identity theft are among the fastest growing crimes plaguing today's youth, and virtual worlds are exposing kids to graphic sex, vice, and violence. We talk candidly to kids (and their parents) about Internet safety and the



threats that exist on the world wide web, and how they can surf safely while online. We also talk to parents about Internet filters and how to monitor the online activities of their children.

### **Character For Kids**

Promoting positive character development and raising the self-confidence and self-esteem of children is an integral part of our program. A confident child is less likely to be abused or targeted by a predator. Kid-Safe promotes the A-B-C Character program:

- Attitude: Be the best you can be
- Belief: Believe in yourself
- Concentration: Focus on success

We also teach the "Character for Kids" program.

### **Rape & Assault Prevention**

Teen and college age girls are at a higher risk of sexual assault or rape than any other age demographic. We teach the "Women-Safe" rape and sexual assault awareness program, covering such topics as rape awareness, street and shopping safety, home safety, date rape drugs, alcohol-induced rape, video terrorism, and more. Ideal for PTOs, small groups, assemblies, or after-school programs.
